"To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America; to maintain law and order; to foster and perpetuate a one hundred percent Americanism; to preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in the Great Wars; to inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation; to combat the autocracy of both the classes and the masses; to make right the master of might; to promote peace and good will on earth; to safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of justice, freedom and democracy; to consecrate and sanctify our comradeship by our devotion to mutual helpfulness.

How can we teach and impress by emphasis or frequent repetition, thereby instilling a sense of individual obligation to our community without starting within our own Post by volunteering? It's a soul-searching question when you delve deep into the role you have as a Legionnaire and therefore a responsibility to volunteer within the Post for events, thereby transmitting to the community your sense of obligation. Events at the Post don't just happen, volunteers are needed and when called for, please step forward. Don't go by the old military cliché "Never Volunteer." Take advantage of the opportunity to put into action the sense of individual obligation to community. Think of Post 1 as the first community you must serve.

American Legion Auxiliary is \$2 Billion (that's with a "B"). That is the value of volunteerism for hours, if paid at market rate, plus the money raised and spent supporting the Auxiliary Mission Outreach.

Unit 1's contribution reported for the 2016-2017 year:
Total Volunteer Hours 1,030.5
Total In-kind Donations \$1,937.20
Total Miles 2,965

Along with the actual dollars donated to the various Legion Programs and Veterans' Organizations the Unit 1 donations totaled \$11,696.50.

American Legion 2018 Oratorical Contest

On July 29, the first meeting of the year for the 2018 American Legion Oratorical Contest was held, and Jay Bowen, Department Commander attended and Janelle Rodriguez conducted the meeting.

An overview of the rules for this year's contest was given and discussion was held regarding the citation of legal cases and the consensus regarding the issue was that judges had the right to call upon the contestant regarding the cases cited and have them explain the case and the precedent set and the effect on the constitution. Also, assigned top-

ics were discussed and the subject of increasing scholarship funds was discussed.

For the State of Colorado, current scholarships for first, second, and third place are \$2,500, \$1,500, and \$1,000, respectively. The increase in scholarship funds was tabled pending a review of finances for the program. For national winners the American Legion awards first, second, and third place scholarships in the amount of \$18,000, \$16,000 and \$14,000, respectively.

Post 1 will send out letters to all schools in our area within the next few weeks and if you know of a high school student that may have an interest in the oratorical contest,

or Boys State and Girls State, please let your Americanism Committee Chairman know and we'll work with the student. The money is on the table so let's see a student from our area win a scholarship. Early preparation of the speech will allow for the correction of mistakes and practice of the speech.

Also, we are looking for judges at the state competition on March 10, 2018. You tell someone on the Americanism Committee that you are interested. The competition will be held at Metropolitan State University at Denver.
