

## Proper Entry Procedures

I believe we all know, but I just wanted to remind the membership that we are a private club. Our license, as such, brings somewhat unique conditions. This is not much unlike something my Dad used to preach to me in my youth: with our rights, comes responsibility.

Our "Club License" issued by the state is what allows us to serve alcohol on the premises. Specifically, it limits that service only to members and their bonafide guests. Nonetheless, this license begs two deeds on our part: a current membership (card) and the proper signing in of guests. If you haven't already done so, present your 2015 membership card to the bartender. She will issue you a key card to be used for access. Please use that card rather than the doorbell. (If you don't have a 2015 card, perhaps it's time to pay your dues!) The doorbell is for non-members. If you bring a guest who uses that bell or enters with you, please ensure that guest is entered into the guest book located to the right of the bar. Moreover, understand your guest can stay only as long as you are there or another member re-signs that guest should you depart beforehand. Finally, please remember you are responsible for your guests' behavior; monitor that behavior as needed.

These are the rules! I'm simply asking you to abide by them because an infraction could jeopardize our license — the livelihood of the Post. One last point to consider; using your key card and complying with these rules is, if nothing else, simply a courtesy to the bar staff. It enables them to attend to their primary job and diminishes the need to scrutinize who is and who is not a guest. I have no doubt that together we can continue to make Post 1 the Post others strive to emulate!

Thank you for the attention I'm confident you'll offer this matter.

### Proposed By-Law Change February 2015

#### ARTICLE VII, Section 3

At the discretion of the membership, during the April or May regular membership meeting, the membership may direct the Delegation Chairman to vote the entire Post delegate strength, at Department Convention, toward a specific candidate or resolution. This provision of the By-Laws shall only be exercised upon a majority vote, in the presence of a quorum, at the regular April or May membership meeting to support an announced candidate or published resolution. Except that an elected delegate may choose to cast his single delegate vote for the candidate or resolution of his choice.

### Proposed Section Change

#### ARTICLE VII, Section 1

Delegates and Alternates to Department Convention shall be elected at the April or May regular post meeting, to be held at least 20 days prior to the date of such convention. Post Executive Board shall determine reimbursement for delegated expenses.
