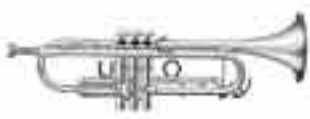

## New Service To Veterans From LCW Post 1

The All Veterans Honor Guard (AVHG), Ft. Logan Team is proud to announce our new association with American Legion Post 1.

In 1993, our government drastically reduced their role in providing final military honors for Veterans. Two Colorado men saw the need and began recruiting Veteran volunteers to fill this gap. By 1994, approximately 100 men had been recruited, six teams were created and the All Veterans Honor Guard was born. Over the next 21 years the AVHG has provided final military honors for over 12,000 Veterans.

Currently five teams remain. They are: Fort Logan, Aurora, Castle Rock, Littleton and Arvada. All teams are associated with American Legion or Veterans of Foreign Wars Posts. We continue to be the only 100 percent volunteer organization that provides this service on a regular basis. For this reason, it is important that the AVHG continues its mission "until the last man standing" regardless of the weather or the number of services requested in a single day. We typically augment the two- or three-man military detail assigned to fold and present the

Flag. We provide a commander who conducts the service, a chaplain, a rifle detail and a bugler.

How can you help? Volunteer! To be a member of the AVHG you must be a Veteran. You must be able to stand at least 30 minutes (unless in a wheel chair) and be available

## New Building Sign

A new elevated sign was installed about February to replace the aging sign that had been in place for several years. The old sign was faded and no longer grabbed the attention of traffic on Yale or I-25... or future members. The new sign was intended not only to advertise the Post, but also the room/event rentals we offer. 
