Steffan Tubbs was the host and he talked about myriad subjects including the American Legion, Veterans, Memorial Day, plus he took the time to chat with members of the Legion families about their particular organization within the Post. We are extremely grateful for the opportunity to let the Denver area listeners know more about the American Legion and our Post. During the broadcast, new members joined the Legion, S.A.L., and Auxiliary. Money donated during the broadcast will go to the Police Body Armor Fund.

Leyden-Chiles-Wickersham Hosts District 6 Convention

On May 11, 2019, Post 1 hosted the District 6 Convention. District 6 Commander Annette Johnson gavelled the meeting to order. Approximately 60 Legionnaires attended, representing many of the 20 Posts within District 6.

The Post and District 6 were honored to have Boy Scout Troop 79, Denver, serve as the Color Guard.

Commander Johnson introduced the host officers and District 6 Unit officers, plus Department officers and Past District Commanders.

District 6 Auxiliary President Diane Erickson gave a brief discussion about the work the Auxiliary does for the military units at Buckley Air Base and discussed the support provided when the troops are being deployed and support for the families after deployment. Department officer and PNC Tom Bock made opening comments regarding District 6 support of the Posts within their district. Officers responsible for the finance, membership, resolutions, constitution and by-laws, Americanism and Children and Youth, Boys State, District Executive Committee, and UVC gave reports.

A few highlights of the reports are listed below:

Membership is within 94.64 percent of their goal and with additional online applications may meet or exceed their goal.

Post 82 presented a resolution regarding the flying of the national flag, in accordance with U.S. flag code, and Post 206 presented a resolution regarding conformity when women veterans wear the American Legion cap. Both proposed resolutions were approved for further consideration and will be sent to the Colorado Department level for review and consideration.

According to the UVC Committee District 6 Chairman, the Colo-

rado Legislature has authorized the printing of a license plate to recognize women service members. Also, it was reported the Veterans Court has a 96 percent success rate for veterans entering a court directed program and completing the program, and the veteran avoids a felony or misdemeanor charge being on their record. In addition, a request for support of Senate Bill 504 was made and attendees were asked to call their Senator and request their sponsorship and support of the legislation. This bill would allow all veterans that served their country, from the end of WWII to the present time, membership in the American Legion regardless of when they served.

The Commander's report included a discussion of setting goals of 100 percent Post revitalization. The Commander reported all District 6 Posts are open, with one new Post, American Legion Centennial Post 2019. The majority of the Posts have increased their membership, and some of the Posts are increasing efforts to stabilize their Post by July. District 6 is now the largest Post District in Colorado.

District 6 elections were held and most current officers were retained for one additional year.

PNC Tom Bock, NEC Tom Florez, ANEC Jay Bowen, DSVC Dean Noechel, and District 6 Commander Johnson gave the closing remarks. In the near future, the full minutes of the meeting will be available for all Legion members.

The Veterans Community Living Center at Fitzsimons serves veterans, veterans spouses and Gold Star Parents. Their mission is to honor and respect those living and working in the Center through companionship, individual care, and providing a comfortable and safe place to live. The facility is a 180-bed facility providing skilled nursing care and a specialized 21-bed short-term rehabilitation unit.

In addition to the above, the following services are also provided: long-term care, Alzheimer's care, end-of-life hospice services, and short-term rehabilitation.

Over the years, the 40/8 Voiture 97 (V97) prepared meals for the residents, visited sick members, helped the staff, and myriad other "good stuff" too numerous to mention. The V97 brings burgers, hot dogs, salads, chips, etc., and prepares a great barbecue outside and will have this annual event on August 17.

Over many years, the Post, V97, S.A.L., and Auxiliary also participated in providing meals and other services to Fitzsimons by donating

funds directly to the Fitzsimons Center, hiring the Sousa Band to play patriotic music, and continuously supporting the veterans with other charitable work. All of this work and volunteer time greatly improves the quality of life for the residents.

In 2018, the Center recognized Brandt Erickson for 15 years of continual support of the Veterans Community Living Center at Fitzsimons.

The Derby event was managed by the SAL and there were many races before the main race, plus drawings and raffles for prizes. Pamela Moore was the winner of the Best Derby Hat award and the

Armed Forces Race winner was the U.S. Navy with the prize money going to Fitzsimons. Approximately \$1,000 was raised for the veterans at the facility. About eight organizations within the Post and members paid a \$75 race purse prize fee for races throughout the day.

All Legion Family members who helped deserve a special thank you for all of the hard work during the Post 1 Kentucky Derby Day. Unlike the real derby, there were no disqualifications, the winner was Fitzsimons, and accolades are in order for the team effort and a tremendous thank you to all participants.

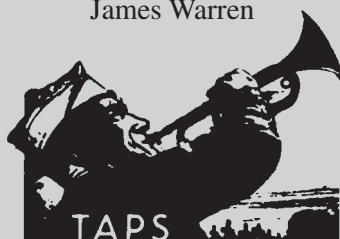
