Richard Bridge

Richard C. Bridge has been a member of the Color Guard for eight years and a member of Post 1 for 13 years. Richard is a native of Denver and enlisted in the U.S. Army in November, 1968, six months after graduation from South High School. He was then sent to Ft. Lewis, Washington, for basic training and advanced infantry training. He served in the Army until November 1971, with the 9th Division, 2nd Battalion, 60th Infantry Division, Bravo Company.

After basic and advanced infantry training, Richard was sent to Tan Tru, Vietnam, with his battalion, where he served as an infantryman and "tunnel rat." He was in Vietnam during a period when the fighting was the heaviest during the war — the Tet Offensive, from January '68 to September '68.

The battle, officially called The General Offensive and Uprising of Tet Mau Than 1968, was one of the largest military campaigns of the war and was launched by forces of the Viet Cong against the South Vietnam Army, U.S. forces, and their allies. It was a campaign of surprise attacks against military and civilian command and control centers throughout South Vietnam. The name of the offensive comes from the Tet holiday, the Vietnamese New

Year, and this is when the first major attacks took place. Richard said his battalion was under constant attack and required the highest level of vigilance possible while in the field.

During one battle, Richard lost his CO and his RTO Transmission operator. His bravery in action during this battle of moving to a position to call in gunship support after the losses in the field earned him a Bronze Star. The Bronze Star was presented to Richard at a Forgotten Hero Award Ceremony 50 years after the battles of the Tet Offensive.

When asked what the American Legion meant to him, Richard thought for a few seconds and with sincerity stated: "Honor, Respect, and Service to Country."

It is with the deepest and most sincere thanks and recognition that Richard C. Bridge is our Legionnaire to be recognized in *The Reveille*.

Veterans Recognized On Vietnam Veterans Day, March 29, 2019

Mike Jarboe and Ron Ice, Vietnam Veterans and members of Post 1, attended the National Vietnam War Veterans Day on March 29. The Vietnamese-American Community of Colorado joined the Vietnam Veterans of America Local 1071 of Denver and the Vietnam Veterans of America Local 1106 of Aurora to honor former soldiers who served in the Vietnam War. Among the dignitaries were members of the Denver City Council, Denver Mayor's Office, Denver Police Department, Colorado State Legislators and U.S. Legislators. A ceremony was held honoring the American flag and the South Vietnam Freedom & Heritage flag.

Veterans from the United States and repatriated South Vietnam veterans were on hand for the presentations, recognition, prayers, and a long deserved "thank you for your

service" recognition. Mr. Steffan Tubbs addressed the crowd and made reference to how much our troops sacrificed and how the Vietnam War still haunts those who served in a combat zone.

May we always recognize those who served during the war, whether in a combat zone or in a support role. 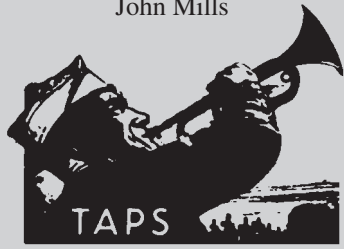
