The following Marines are credited with raising the flag on Iwo Jima: Harold Schultz, Rene Gagnon, Ira Hays, Harlon Block, Michael Strank, and Franklin Sousley. Rene Gagnon did not help raise the flag but is credited with providing the flag. These men were part of the Battle of Iwo Jima which began on February 19, 1945, and lasted 36 days. The Marine troops numbered 70,000 fighting 18,000 Japanese soldiers. The death toll exceeded 6,500 with 20,000 wounded. The tiny island is located approximately 660 miles south of Tokyo and is currently called Iwo To.

Hoorah to the Marines and soldiers who were successful in taking the tiny, crucial, strategically located island.

Why The American Flag Is Folded Thirteen Times?

I've known the 21-gun salute was determined (adding the individual digits of 1776) and this is why the Flag is folded 13 times when it is lowered or when it is folded and handed to the spouse or relative at the burial of a veteran.

Here it is:

The First fold of our Flag is a symbol of life.

The Second fold is a symbol of our belief of eternal life.

The Third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veterans departing our ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

The Fourth fold represents our weaker nature, for it's American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in time of war for His divine guidance.

The Fifth fold is a tribute to our country, for in the Words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries may she always be right; but it is still Our Country, right or wrong," and freedoms we enjoy today.

The Sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

The Seventh fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our Flag against her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our Republic.

The Eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor mothers, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The Ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood for it is through their faith, their love, loyalty, and devotion that the character of the men and women

who have made this country great has been molded.

The Tenth fold is a tribute to the father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since they were first born.

The Eleventh fold, in the eyes of a Hebrew citizen, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon, and glorifies in their eyes, the God of Abra-

ham, Isaac, and Jacob.

The Twelfth fold, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son, and Holy Ghost.

The Thirteenth fold. When the Flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost reminding us of our nation's motto, "In God We Trust."

After the flag is completely fold-

ed and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the Soldiers who served under General George Washington and Sailors and Marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones, who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States of America, preserving for us the rights and privileges we enjoy today.

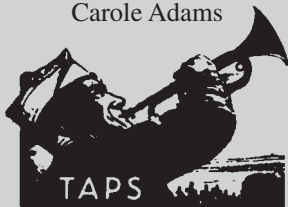
