### Americanism

The Wall That Heals and Mobile Education Center was in Brighton, Carmichael Park, September 2-5. There was a respectful representation from the City of Brighton: The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, Rotary Club, Young Marines, Colorado American Legion and Members, and numerous volunteers were instrumental in the buildout and then the teardown.

The Wall That Heals exhibit features a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in

Washington, D.C. The replica is 375 feet in length and stands 7.5 feet high at its tallest point. Visitors experience The Wall rising above them as they walk toward the apex, a key feature of the design of The Wall in D.C.

Machine engraving of the more than 58,000 names along with modern LED lighting provide the visitor with an emotional experience of The Wall — day and night.

The names on The Wall and Wall That Heals are listed by day of casualty. Beginning at the center from the East Wall then around to the far end of the West Wall, then back into the center — the beginning and end of the Vietnam War.

Fund is pleased to bring The Wall That Heals mobile exhibit to Brighton, Colorado, to allow local veterans and their family members a chance to experience The Wall. We will work carefully with the host to provide a safe opportunity for the community to experience the healing and educational aspects of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. Hosting The Wall That Heals provides an opportunity to honor and remember all those who served and sacrificed in the Vietnam War

and educate visitors on the continuing impact of the Vietnam War on America."

To many of us, these are important events, and are possible with community involvement and dedicated volunteers at all levels. It is imperative we, Post 1, continue to be part of the greater community.

The American Legion Post 1 participation in the Community is as strong as our membership base. For those who have not renewed, it is
